



MLA Style for Electronic Resources: Non-Literary

I. CITING ARTICLES FROM GALILEO DATABASES

Most citations include these pieces of information:

Author's name (if given); article title in quotations; source of the article underlined followed by date, issue, volume and page information.

Database name underlined. Examples: Academic Search Premier or JSTOR.

Online service name. Examples: EBSCOhost, JSTOR, or Lexis-Nexis.

Library where accessed: Georgia Perimeter College Lib.

City/town where information was accessed: Clarkston, GA.

Date when you read the article online. Example: 10 Aug. 2006.

Web address of online service. Example: <<http://www.ebscohost.com>>.

II. CITING ARTICLES FROM OPPOSING VIEWPOINTS RESOURCE CENTER

Use the "Source Citation" information at the end of the article to write your citation. You will need author's name, title of article in quotes, original publication date, title of volume underlined, series name, publisher, date of reprint, database name, online service name, where accessed, date accessed, and web address.

III. CITING ARTICLES FROM CQ ELECTRONIC LIBRARY

EXAMPLE:

Hatch, David. "Are Drug Prices Kept Unfairly High?" CQ Researcher. 6 Jun. 2003. CQ Researcher. CQ Electronic Library. Georgia Perimeter College Lib., Clarkston, GA. 26 Aug. 2003 < <http://library.cqpress.com/> >.

IV. CITING ARTICLES FROM FACTS ON FILE WORLD NEWS DIGEST

EXAMPLE:

Doering, Christopher. "Forecasters See Less Active Hurricane Season." Facts on File World News Digest. 8 Aug. 2006. Facts on File News Services. Georgia Perimeter College Lib., Clarkston, GA. 10 Aug. 2006 < <http://www.facts.com>>.

V. CITING ELECTRONIC BOOKS (eBOOKS) FROM NETLIBRARY

EXAMPLE:

Wells, Gail. The Tillamook: A Created Forest Comes of Age. Cornwallis, OR: Oregon State P, 1999. NetLibrary. Georgia Perimeter College Lib., Clarkston, GA. 29 Aug. 2003 <<http://www.netLibrary.com>>.

VI. CITING ARTICLES AND WEB SITES FROM THE INTERNET (See *MLA Handbook* 2003, pp. 207-224, for many examples of how to write Internet citations.)
